ECSACOP President's Welcome message: A DECADE OF ECSACOP

I am delighted to welcome you to this significant and celebratory milestone in the history of training in internal medicine within the East Central Southern Africa College of Physicians (ECSACOP) region, and specifically to Mombasa, Kenya.

The first decade of ECSACOP has been a rollercoaster. It all began in 2015 with the inauguration of the college by regional governments. A significant effort has been invested in establishing Standard Operating Procedures for accrediting training institutions, Training of Trainers, and developing uniform and coherent assessment methods for both formative and summative assessments across the region, with training commencing in 2018. Since then, we have graduated three cohorts, and on this occasion, we will graduate the fourth cohort in the region and the inaugural one for Kenya. It is a great honour that this is happening in Kenya. The first decade has seen tremendous growth in collegiality within the regions and beyond. All this progress would not have been possible without the support of our collaborators, including the Royal College of Physicians (RCP), London; the West African College of Physicians (WACP); and the Royal College of Physicians, Edinburgh, as well as WHO-AFRO, among others. Special mention is due to Prof. Mumtaz Patel, the current President of RCP, and Prof. Victor Ansa of the WACP, who have personally been at the forefront of monitoring and aiding the progress of the College. Special mention also goes to all the National Physician Associations of the ECASCOP member countries, namely, KAP-Kenya, MACOPH-Malawi, UAP-Uganda, ZACOPH-Zambia, and NAPA-Zimbabwe. The members of these associations have tirelessly worked, pro bono, to ensure that ECSACOP training thrives in their respective countries.

The first decade, however, has faced its challenges. The main challenge we encountered was securing sufficient funding for the programme, both locally and regionally. As noted, in-country Physician associations have borne the primary responsibility for ensuring everything runs smoothly. Moving forward, I urge us to seek adequate funding from all possible sources, including governments and philanthropists. The training has improved the quality of patient care at participating institutions. We, as ECSACOP, are collecting data as evidence of this, which will be published soon. Our primary goal is to expand training sites locally and across the region. The ECSACOP region has a population of approximately 210 million, with only about 2,000 internal medicine specialists (physicians). The gap must be bridged. It is essential that quality training is maintained; therefore, there is a need for sufficient funding to support the holistic training process.

A special tribute is paid to Professor Mohammed Abdullah, may his soul rest in peace; a son of Mombasa who played a pivotal role in the establishment of ECSACOP training in Kenya.

Welcome to Mombasa. Let's meet and plan our journey ahead for the next decade. Please take some time to enjoy all that Mombasa, Pwani, has to offer.
